■Dialogue for Introduction

- T: Hello, Edward! How are you this fine spring day?
- E: Ohh ... not so good. I have a splitting headache ... uhh ...
- T: Ah! You must have that bane of all nature lovers... Hay Fever! This is the season, isn't it?
- E: No! I have speech fever!
- T: Speech fever?! What sort of ailment is that?
- E: It is an ailment common to many English teachers here in Japan. We become so frustrated trying to encourage our students to clearly state their ideas in their speeches that we get a raging fever!
- T: Really?!
- E: Just kidding!! But, you know, Tets, it really is challenging for Japanese students of English to get away from using what we call the Asian model of presentation.
- T: Yes! I have heard that the indirect style of communication we often value here in Japan doesn't often lend itself well to creating a good speech in English.
- E: Exactly! Consider the assignment I asked my students to do: 'Agree or disagree: World poverty can be eliminated.' I told them to choose and discuss three of the following points: Education, Globalization, Political Corruption, Population Growth, Technology or The United Nations. The time limit is to be two minutes. So far, none of my students have been able to state their ideas clearly and convincingly!
- T: That is ideal for our topic this month! Let's examine one of your students' speeches given in this Oriental style. We need to be more aware of the strong influence of Japanese, which is of course our first language.
- E: Let's begin.
- T: Yes, let's.

Scene 1

T: Now, let us listen to one of their speeches.

E: Right. Please listen to this one.

There are many poor people in the world. At school, those poor students can not come to school because they work. In some countries, parents ask their children to help them make money. Education in such a country is not successful because children's parents are in poverty. There are no parents who don't want their children to go to school. Parents may want their children to become rich but as they are poor they have no money to send them to school. It is a sad thing because despite the fact that parents know that going to school is essential for their children for their better future but it is against their understanding. In poor families, children are working and children who are rich are studying at school. Those poor children want to go to school but they have to help their parents because their parents are poor. I said there are no parents who don't want their children to go to school. It is true, isn't it? Why can't they send their children to school? Because they are poor. It is a sad thing. They have to buy food but they know they can not become rich if education is important for the future of children. Parents know that it is important for their future. Because as I said, it is essential for children's future. Even though parents know that education is important and also if their children go to school and learn, they can build their skills which will help them make money later because children can get better jobs after learning at school. And the leaders of the country know such poverty is never likely to cope with the rapid changing world where globalization is spreading at the same time the country will remain as a poor country.

My conclusion is that the United Nations should help such poor countries because the United Nations was established to help such poor countries where parents want their children to go to school despite the fact that they are too poor to achieve their aim and it is the only international organization in the world with supports of many countries. The United Nations

T: Thank you. That's enough. The speech seems to be going on endlessly without actually addressing the topic.

■Scene 2

- E: Before the student starts to move on to the point about what the United Nations is expected to do, let's straighten up that first paragraph.
- T: Listeners, why don't you try yourself? Please read the script of this student's speech and help her to clarify the points she wishes to make. Later, you can come back and compare your version with ours.
- T: Now, Edward, what do you think are the points that this student wants to make?
- E: The points that this student wants to make seem to be:
 - ① I agree. I think that world poverty can be eliminated.
 - ② Education is important in the elimination of poverty.
 - ③ The reason is that children can learn and develop skills to get better jobs.
 - ④ The problem is that poor families can not send their children to schools because they can not afford to do so and they need their children's help in supporting the family. In other words, children have to work.
 - ⑤ The U.N. is expected to offer more help to those poor families.
 - 6 We therefore should help the U.N. more.
 - 7 Then, we can eliminate poverty.
- T: Thank you, Edward. The points are now much better and more clearly stated. The speech now has a smoother flow. Now, here comes the improved speech by the same speaker. Listeners, why won't you make your own speech covering all these 7 points before listening to the improved speech?

Improved

I agree. I think that world poverty can be eliminated. First, we should begin with education. Education is very important to eliminate poverty or help poverty-stricken societies. Because children can learn a lot of knowledge and develop skills that can be used in their future when they work or when they get better jobs.

However, the problem is that poor families cannot afford to send their children to schools because they need their children's help in making money. In such families children have to go to work.

I hope that the U.N. and its related organizations will offer more help in more efficient ways.

They have been working hard to help such poor families for many years and the U.N. is the international organization, which is supported by the largest number of countries. If we help the U.N. and its related organizations more, I think we can eliminate world poverty.

T: Now, here comes a more sophisticated one by Edward.

In my opinion, it is possible to eliminate world poverty if correct action is taken. The fact is that there is a vicious circle involving poverty and insufficient education in poor countries.

Poor families need everyone, including children, to contribute to the basic needs of the family. This means that their children cannot attend school on a regular basis. These children cannot develop skills needed for better jobs.

This cycle will continue until a third party intervenes to help better their education. The United Nations and its related branches are well suited to make such help available. With the help of such organizations, world poverty can indeed be eliminated.

T: Thank you for showing us such an effective example.

■Scene 3

- T: Here are some key points to remember if you want to become a better writer.
 - 1 Lengthy and redundant writings and speeches are difficult for anyone to understand.

Example

The consumption tax is going to be raised and I think it is not a good idea because there are many things that we can do before raising the consumption tax as many people point out that our government is wasting a lot of money and using our tax in a very inefficient way.

Listeners, before moving on to the next section, please rewrite and improve this lengthy sentence.

Improved.

I am against the government's plan to raise the consumption tax. Because many people point out that our government is using money in a wasteful way. Before raising consumption tax, the government should think more about how to use our tax efficiently.

• Further Improved Example by Edward

I am opposed to any increase in the consumption tax. As we often hear, government waste is rampant. Before any increase in the consumption tax, we should insist that the government makes efficient use of the resources it now has.

■Closing Dialogue

- T: State your conclusion, support your conclusion, explain why you think so, and restate your conclusion!
- E: Yes! When dealing with people from other countries and cultures we should be aware of cultural differences and different communication styles.
- T: When a child becomes a primary school pupil, he or she will soon make friends with...how many?

- T: That brings us to our conclusion.
- E: Please think over a broad range of topics. Writing or giving a speech on topics of interest to you is without a doubt one of the best language building activities you can do.
